授業の概要／Course outline	<p>The aim of this course is to provide basic organized knowledge and discussions on the East Asian history and its “cultural backgrounds”, which might lead to deeper and better insights into the contemporary issues of the region. The course will consist of three parts.</p> <p>Firstly it will focus on the Chinese philosophical and religious traditions which had come to be shared in the whole East Asian region (*Confucianism, Taoism and Chinese Buddhism in particular) and their various local developments. The political and social structures of the pre-modern states based on these ideologies will be also discussed.</p> <p>In the second part, the historical conditions of East Asia in the early modern period will be considered. (1) The huge multiple Qing Empire, (2) the diplomatic and cultural interactions between Qing and the surrounding states and peoples, and (3) the problem of pre-modern “éθνies” in the region will be the main topics of this part.</p> <p>The third part will be a brief introduction to the modern history of East Asia after the mid-19th century. Especially, (1) the different processes of “nation building” in China and Japan, (2) the “Imperial Japan” and its colonialism, and (3) the ethnic problems of modern Chinese (both republican and communist) state will be examined in detail.</p> <p>The course will be comprised of (I) “general lecture” and (II) “student presentations based on assigned readings”. Student presentations will be set up during the latter half of the semester. Participation of students will be required in both of (I) and (II).</p>		
到達目標／Learning objectives	By acquiring basic knowledge about the topics above, students are expected to have an elementary understanding of the East Asian traditional cultures in general and the intricate contexts of the region’s history, especially its modern history. It will be helpful for them to gain deeper and better insights on several contemporary and resent issues which are causing serious conflicts between Japan and its neighbouring countries.
