到達目標/Learning objectives	Where this class provides an overview of theoretical and conceptual explanations of Japanese politics scholarship, it is also designed to stimulate a critical approach to understanding issues in historical and current Japanese politics. Upon completion of this course, students will have developed appropriate skills to:  - develop a base knowledge of key issues in Japanese politics and scholarship;  - identify and interpret critical issues in Japanese politics;  - apply ideas learned from the case of Japan to an international and globalised context.  Furthermore, the course content and assignments are designed so that students can:  - synthesize and apply outside perspectives with their own thinking;  - develop critical evaluations through comparison and critical thinking;  - construct objective and reason-based arguments;  - engage in debate with peers, and learn to be open-minded about others' views;  - convey meaningful responses to critical questions in objective, formal academic writing;  - develop self-reflective skills to which they can apply to any context;  - continue a life-long learning process and promote curiosity.
