The second part of the course examines the political economy of East Asia by first introducing Japan and its distinctive model of political economy. The course then reviews how this model has been copied by many other countries in Asia and examines the effect of China's economic rise on the region. How does China's rapid growth alter economic strategies and outcomes in East Asia?
