授業の概要／Course outline	This course examines the international relations of East Asia and the US focusing on diplomacy, economic exchange, and conflict in the Asia-Pacific region. The course begins by introducing and applying traditional IR theory to East Asia with a focus on security. Do theories largely created and tested in Europe provide useful explanations for international relations in East Asia? The second part of the course examines the political economy of East Asia by first introducing Japan and its distinctive model of political economy. The course then reviews how this model has been copied by many other countries in Asia and examines the effect of China's economic rise on the region. How does China's rapid growth alter economic strategies and outcomes in East Asia?		
到達目標／Learning objectives	This course has three main goals. Students will apply the major concepts, theories, and topics in the study of international relations to East Asia. Second, students will improve their understanding of current international issues in East Asia related to international security and international political economy. Third, students will engage in analytical and critical thinking.
