授業の概要／Course outline	In the final decades of the 20th century, there was a so-called "third wave of democratisation", with many scholars pointing to Asia as the hotspot for democratic struggle. Today, this view has been somewhat substantiated. However, struggles for democracy remain, as do the legacies of authoritarian regimes. Therefore, this course focuses on the historical and contemporary factors that fuel both drivers of, and challenges to, democracy in East Asia by providing an overview of the political cultures across the region. Because this course does not focus on one particular country it will be useful for students interested in East Asian politics, regional political developments, and political cultures in general.		
到達目標／Learning objectives	<p>Upon completion of this course, students will have or be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- developed a base knowledge of key political issues that covers the East Asia region;</li> <li>- contextualised historical political developments in the region;</li> <li>- apply ideas learned from each case study and apply it to a global context.</li> </ul> <p>Furthermore, the course content and assignments are designed so that students can:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- synthesize and apply outside perspectives with their own thinking;</li> <li>- develop critical evaluations through comparison and critical thinking;</li> <li>- construct objective and reason-based arguments;</li> <li>- engage in debate with peers, and learn to be open-minded about others' views;</li> <li>- convey meaningful responses to critical questions in objective, formal academic writing; - develop self-reflective skills to which they can apply to any context;</li> <li>- continue a life-long learning process and promote curiosity;</li> <li>- develop independent research and academic writing skills.</li> </ul>

履修上の注意事項／Course guidelines	<p>Students must purchase the assigned textbook, although I will endeavour to have the library acquire a copy and place it on reserve. Extra materials to match learning activities might be distributed in class. Two forms of assignments, in-class multiple choice questions and student-led discussions require weekly readings to be completed BEFORE class. Students are required to revise their classwork materials and additional content for at least 2-3 hours for every class session. It is advised that students revise their class notes and materials within a 24 hour period. This indicated time should be considered as a minimum to cover any additional reading or materials that are provided throughout the course, as well as time for revision and critical thinking.</p> <p>NOTE:</p> <p>It is possible that this EAS course will be conducted in a hybrid style (on-line and on-campus) for at least part, if not all, of the Autumn term.</p> <p>The hybrid style has been approved as a special measure to allow in-bound international students to participate in the EAS courses that they have enrolled in.</p> <p>The hybrid style will be used as long as any inbound international student is unable to attend in person. Once inbound international students have cleared quarantine, they must attend the course face-to-face at Musashi University.</p> <p>Any student who is not an in-bound international student is expected to attend the course face-to-face at Musashi University from the first class.</p> <p>The lecturer of the course will use the assigned classroom on campus to conduct classes.</p> <p>While the course is conducted as a hybrid, students may be required to bring their own device. This decision will be left to the discretion of the course lecturer.</p>
